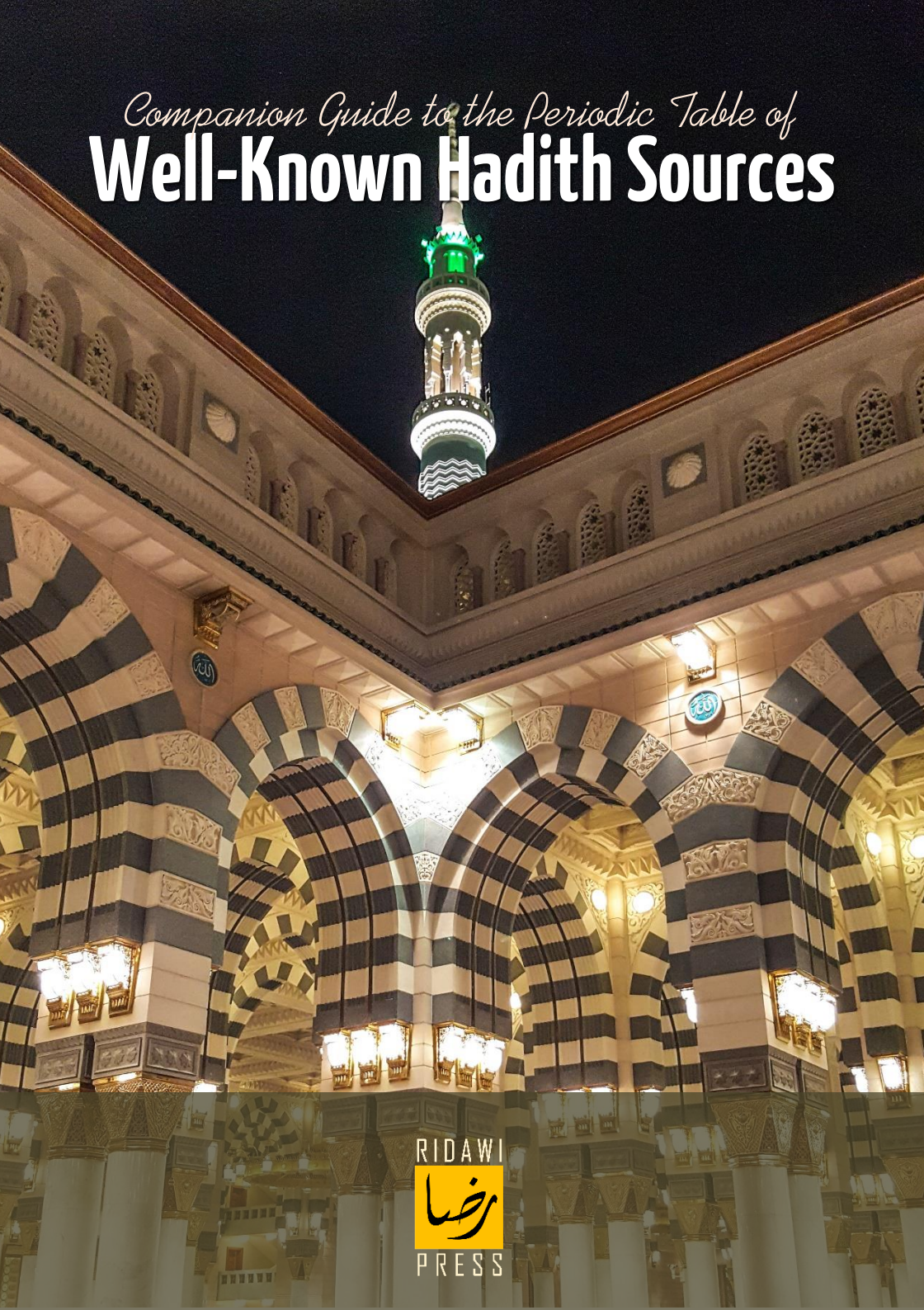

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FOREWORD

All praise to Allāh . We ask Allāh táālā to send blessings upon the Prophet ﷺ and give him greetings of peace - and upon his descendants and his companions.

This monograph is a brief list of well-known ḥadīth works, as a companion guide to the Infographic: *Periodic Table of Well-Known Ḥadīth Sources*.¹

I have always been fascinated with books of ḥadīth – ever since I embarked on my journey towards learning ḥadīth sciences, many years ago. The most famous ḥadīth work in South Asia,² after the six motherbooks is *Mishkāt al-Maṣābīḥ*. Indian scholars frequently cite it in their books and *fatāwā*. When I first began reading it, I noticed that Bukhārī, Muslim and other works were cited as ‘sources’ and I wondered if there were other sources (not mentioned in *Mishkāt*). In one of his works, Imām Aḥmad Riḍā Khān mentions that he frequently teaches and refers to more than fifty ḥadīth works and named thirty books.³ It was also my habit to note down the names of books (and authors if available) mentioned in books that I read. Once, I interacted with a Shāfiʿī scholar, who advised me to visit a madrasah in Kerala if I wished to browse ḥadīth books. I visited the well-known madrasah, as advised by the shaykh.

I was overwhelmed by the number of books I saw in the library. I requested the bemused librarian to let me stay and make notes, to which he agreed without a second thought. I spent a few days there and made a list of hundreds of books which also included fiqh, áqīdah and other subjects. In the coming years I would make a few more trips to the madrasah to browse books in the library.

Over the years, it became a hobby to make notes of the names of books and authors. I would make notes by visiting book-fairs, from bibliographies of books and book-lists. With the explosion of PDFs, I would collect, categorise and store books.

One of the earliest reader's guide to ḥadīth works I came across was *Bustān al-Muhaddithin*, by the great Indian ḥadīth master, Shaykh Ábdu'l Ázīz Dihlawī. It is a well-known work (in the subcontinent), which introduces the reader to one hundred books of ḥadīth, including commentaries and works on ḥadīth principles. Another work with a list of ḥadīth sources is *Jam' al-Jawāmi'y* of Imām Jalāluddīn Suyūṭī, in which he attempted to consolidate ḥadīth from nearly 100 books.⁴ I had now made two lists (from both works) in a tabular format⁵ – and I was working on classification of books, when I found Kattānī's *Al-Mustaṭrafah*.⁶

Based on Kattānī's categorisation of ḥadīth works, and perusal of numerous bibliographies, I have compiled a list of **165** well-known works of ḥadīth. This is neither an exhaustive, nor a definitive list. The main objective of this periodic table is to revive an interest among Muslims in the ḥadīth literature, to educate students, scholars and commoners on the rich heritage of ḥadīth literature by presenting it in a visually attractive format. We ask Allāh tāālā to forgive us and guide us on the straight path.

CATEGORIES OF BOOKS IN THE INFOGRAPHIC: PERIODIC TABLE OF WELL-KNOWN HĀDĪTH SOURCES

Imām Muḥammad ibn Jaáfar al-Kattānī has mentioned more than fifty categories of ḥadīth books in his *Risālah Mustatrafah*, from which I have selected 36 categories for the Periodic Table and the most famous – and published - works in each category. In the *Mutaḥfarriqāt*/Miscellany row, I have included one or two works from the following categories:

Gharayib: Ḥadīth dictionaries of arcane words.

Áqāyid: Ḥadīth are related to belief and theology.

Afrād: Lone-narrator reports.

Taşawwuf: Ḥadīth that pertain to moral rectitude and piety

Fadāyil: Ḥadīth of superiority, virtues and merits of person, place, an action or good deed etc.

Ṭibb: Ḥadīth that speak of health, medicine and cure.

Fawāyid: Notes of masters concerning ḥadīth, narrators etc.

Zuhd: Ḥadīth that speak of frugality and abstemiousness; of withdrawing from worldly pleasures and abstaining from luxury.

Amāli: Annotations of ḥadīth masters.

Marāsil: Collection of Mursal ḥadīth.

Fitan: Ḥadīth that speak of End-days, eschatology.

Nasikh-Mansukh: Ḥadīth that are related to abrogation.

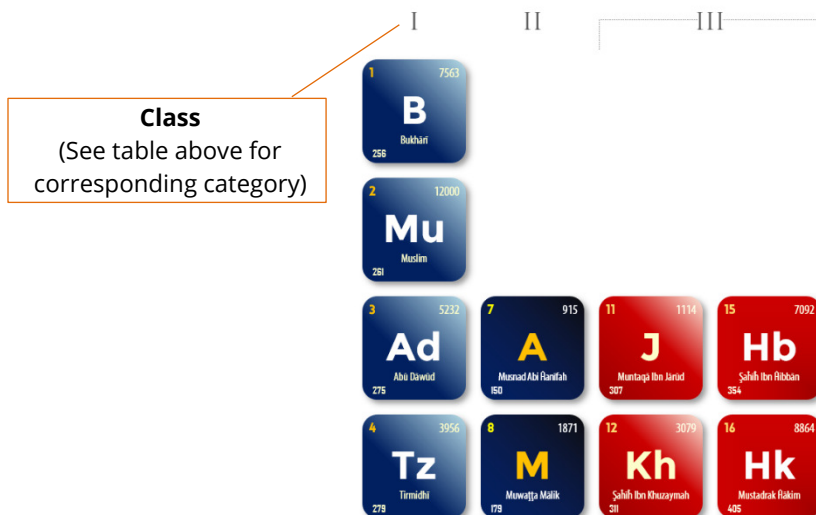
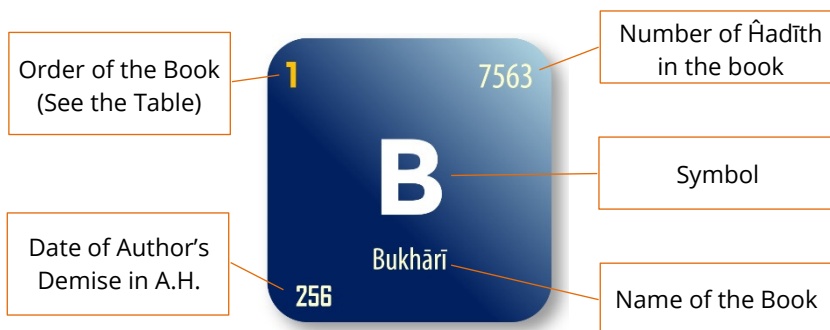

Notes:

1. This is not a definitive list of books. Certain books which are considered as important sources by ḥadīth masters or jurists might have been omitted.
2. The shortlist was based on the two lists: one from *Bustān* and another from *Jam' al-Jawāmi'*. However, some works in both the lists belong to related sciences and not ḥadīth narrations per se – such as *Asmā'a al-Rijāl* (biographies of narrators) and *Uṣūl al-Ḥadīth* (ḥadīth principles). Some others are commentaries of well-known sources. Hence they are not included in the Periodic Table.
3. Several important works in the mentioned categories are omitted if they are either short (few ḥadīth) such as Bayhaqī's *Ḥayātu'l Anbiyā'a fī Qubūrihim* or Bukhārī's *Ra' al-Yadayn fī's Ṣalāt* – or if they are very brief anthologies, such as the numerous *Arbayīn* collections.
4. One of the major criterion for inclusion in the Periodic Table is the availability of the work. Almost all the works that figure in the PT are published and are available as PDFs. Works such as *Ṣaḥīḥ al-Ismā'yīlī* or *Tafsīr Marduwayh* which are apparently lost – are not listed.
5. The number of ḥadīth indicated in the table are taken from published works. In some cases, the ḥadīth are not numbered and hence they are left blank.
6. The books are usually ordered chronologically in each category, except in columns with multiple categories. The first six are ordered as they are universally identified top six ḥadīth sources.

7. Symbols are mostly based on the name of the book, the author, or his appellations etc. Usually single letters are reserved for the seniormost ḥadīth masters or the most famous works.
8. The date of demise of the author/compiler of the work is mentioned in the bottom left corner of the box.

BRIEF DEFINITIONS OF CATEGORIES OF ĤADĪTH BOOKS

A brief description of categories of books and examples of the genre are mentioned below. The following list is prepared from Imām Muḥammad ibn Jaáfar al-Kattānī's *Al-Mustaṭṭrafah*.
